## Reponement of Villiers Conclave No. 9 Red Cross of Constantine

On Thursday 6th December 2012, the Grand Sovereign of the Red Cross of Constantine, Most Illustrious Knight Richard Wallis, GCC, assisted by Officers of Grand Imperial Conclave, carried out the Ceremony of Reponement of Villiers Conclave No. 9 in a most impressive manner. The Grand Eusebius then carried out a full Ceremony of Installation to the delight of all present.

The new Sovereign, Puissant Knight Keith Waters then appointed and invested the remainder of his Officers.

The Grand Sovereign, his Assisting Officers and the Intendant General were elected Honorary Members.

At a very convivial lunch, the newly Installed Sovereign Puissant Knight Keith Waters, thanked the Grand Sovereign and his team for their most impressive contribution to the days proceedings and also thanked the Intendant General Right Illustrious Knight Peter Fuchter, for the help and encouragement he had received from him leading up to the Reponement. He also said that the Reponement simply would not have happened had it not been for the tireless efforts of the Conclaves Recorder, Right Illustrious Knight Roy Leavers who had been a constant source of help, encouragement and sage advice from the very start of the process.
